Schools are ranked here by Average Score (on a scale of 200-800) rather than % Met/Exceeded Achievement Level. This is less than ideal. We would prefer to compare schools based on the percentage of students reaching the achievement goals, but there are too many schools for which CSDE is unable to report that number for privacy reasons.

Using averages can often present difficulties. As an example, compare the performance of Classical Magnet School and Pathways Academy on SAT Math. You will note that *on average*, students at Classical scored 17 points higher; yet, a greater percentage of Pathways students reached the achievement goal.

For this reason, we encourage the reader to interpret these rankings with a certain degree of caution.
